18.1.4 Course and Unit Exemption

Students may be granted exemption from courses if they have taken similar or equivalent postgraduate courses with satisfactory performance (“B” grade or above). 18.2 Candidacy Examination

18.2.1 Format

Each student will have to attend a candidacy examination before the end of the maximum pre-candidacy period. Candidacy examination will be comprehensive and rigorous, including two parts: Part I - A comprehensive written examination; and Part II - Thesis proposal and oral defence (see Section 18.3). A student must achieve pass in both Parts to pass the Candidacy Examination.
